ELA

We took a break from informational text to read the classic story, Peter Pan. We have been looking closely at the characters and their actions. The kids are doing a great job using vivid words to describe the characters. We have also put on our detective hats to use context clues to figure out new vocabulary words. Some words are already familiar to students, but they are used in different ways, which makes for a great learning experience! Math

We are just starting with fractions! We may not realize it, but we use fractions all the time! Students love fractions because it helps them understand the concept of sharing and equal parts. I use examples that kids are familiar with, like measuring for baking and cooking, pizza and chocolate! As we move along, we will greater than and less than and different shapes with fractions.

Science

We are exploring the wonderful world of rocks! We just started a new unit on the different types of rocks and how they are formed. The three types of rocks are igneous rocks, metamorphic rocks and sedimentary rocks. Once we learn about the types of rocks, we will explore how Geologists study rock cycle and weathering.

Teacher of the Week

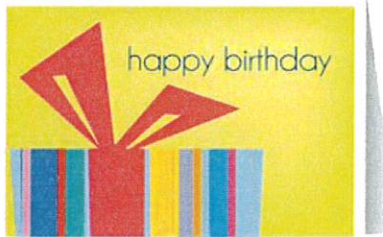

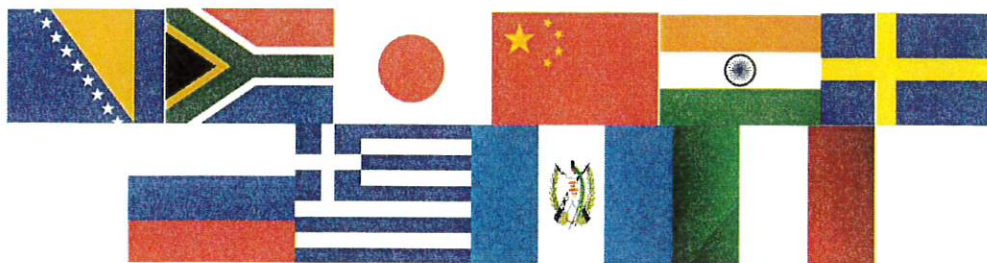
