-The submission deadline is Friday, February 28th by 3 pm. Any letters submitted after this deadline will not be judged.

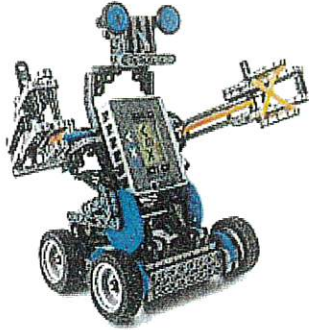
