interventions that
supplement the regular
instructional program of
the school. struggling
students.

The needs of students who are struggling in the regular education environment may be addressed with strategies, such as additional instructional time, smaller group or individual instruction, or alternate instructional approaches.

For the teachers and staff at the school, Title I funds can be used to provide professional learning opportunities that improve instructional practices, especially when teaching.
